Dear Lions of Multiple District 410,

At the bottom of the page you will see listed the new Operation Brightsight Management Committee members elected to serve for the period 2017/18.

At the recent Council Meeting held in Amanzimtoti on August 19th my report to council showed a marked improvement in the performance of Lions Operation Brightsight in the fiscal year 2016/7 compared with the previous year. Profit for 2016/7 was R28,299 compared with R8,799 for 2015/6. We are truly grateful for the contribution from Christmas Cake sales where every cake sold provides a one rand boost to our income. I therefore encourage all Lions to participate in the Lions Christmas cake project.

I would also like to comment on the script submission performance showing the comparison of the districts for the years 2015/6 and 2016/7

The turn-around performance of receipt of script to the despatch of spectacles has improved to the point where we can offer a one week service in most cases dependent on script requirements.

I thank all clubs that are participating in the project and hope you will continue to do so and encourage all your zone clubs that are not involved to join the Brightsight family.
